Poison Facts:

What You Should Know about Syrup of Ipecac

In 2003, the American Academy of Pediatrics (AAP) announced its new policy on poison treatment in the home. The most notable change: The AAP no longer recommends ipecac as a home treatment.

- Syrup of ipecac should no longer be used as a poison treatment in the home.
- Parents and other caregivers should safely dispose of any syrup of ipecac currently in their homes.
- Activated charcoal should not be given in the home either because its effectiveness and safety in that setting have not been proven.
- If you suspect a child has ingested a poisonous substance, call the Poison Control Center immediately.
